Age-Friendly Greater Pittsburgh and the JCC of Greater Pittsburgh Announce Enhanced Partnership and Commitment to Age Inclusion

PITTSBURGH, PA (February 4, 2025): Age-Friendly Greater Pittsburgh and the Jewish Community Center of Greater Pittsburgh are strengthening their partnership, advancing age inclusion in a region with one of the highest concentrations of older adults in the United States.

The JCC of Greater Pittsburgh (the JCC) is now serving as the host agency for Age-Friendly Greater Pittsburgh, housing Age-Friendly staff at their Squirrel Hill location. As longtime partners, the two entities will continue to operate independently, but deepen their collaboration and commitment to bringing generations together.

"It is the best fit," says Laura Poskin, Executive Director of Age-Friendly Greater Pittsburgh, an initiative dedicated to making the region more inclusive and respectful of all ages. "Every day, our team is inspired by the multigenerational space, buzzing with toddlers, teens, parents, college students, retirees—you name it. In an age of isolation, the JCC is one of those rare and special places where lives intersect, and we're all better for it."

The JCC brings field leading collaborative aging services to the Pittsburgh community through its involvement in AgeWell Pittsburgh, a nationally recognized collaborative effort with engaged partners from Jewish Family & Community Services, Jewish Association on Aging, the Jewish Federation of Greater Pittsburgh, and a nationally accredited senior center with a variety of programming and lunchtime meals, in both its Squirrel Hill and South Hills locations. The JCC also houses childcare centers at both locations, as well as state-of-the-art fitness and wellness facilities, temperature-controlled indoor pools, gymnasiums, dance studios, classrooms and meeting areas.

A leader in the World Health Organization and AARP Network of Age-Friendly Communities—which includes 900+ communities nationwide, as well as 12 states— Age-Friendly Greater Pittsburgh brings generations together to reimagine where we live, work and play, so people of all ages can thrive. The initiative's Action Plan, created in partnership with 120 organizations including the JCC, sets forth a bold vision for intergenerational connection and aging in community. It includes a forthcoming media campaign to prevent ageism and promote age inclusion, as well as trainings for employers to strengthen and better support a multigenerational workforce.
